- Murdered by Stalin



Willi Münzenberg



Münzenberg Strategies:

- You do not call yourself a communist
- You claim to be an independent-minded idealist
- **You ... think the little guy is getting a lousy break**
- **■**You believe in open-mindedness
- You are shocked, frightened by what is going on right here in our own country
- You're frightened by the racism, by the oppression of the workingman
- You believe in peace
- You yearn for international understanding
- You hate fascism
- You think the capitalist system is corrupt
- You say it over and over again. And you say nothing, nothing more


Georgi Lukacs

- "...revolutionary destruction of society [is] the one and only solution to the cultural contradictions of the epoch."
- Strategy: sex as a weapon
- Advocated Cultural Terrorism:
 - Explicit sex education in schools
 - Female "sexual liberation"



Antonio Gramsci

- Wrote "Prison Notebooks"
- Advocated intellectuals promote Marxism by penetrating institutions
- "War of position" to challenge dominant "cultural hegemony"
- Notebooks translated by Pete Buttigieg's father



Cultural Marxism

- Lukacs and Munzenberg ideas inspired Frankfurt School founded in 1923
- Frankfurt School relocated to Columbia Teachers College in 1930s
- Edward R. Murrow-Int'l Inst. Education
- John Dewey facilitated relocation
- Frankfurt School inspired New York City's New School for Social Research
- Created Critical Theory

Dewey & the Frankfurt School

"John Dewey's sponsorship gave the Institute a lock on Teacher's College the foremost educational institution in the U.S. The influence of Teacher's College, in fact, reached out across the country, as its *graduates filled more* that 60 percent of all teaching and educational and administrative posts in the country." — Nathanael Blake Human Events, 5/15/2007

- 12. <u>Authoritarian Personality</u>





Hate America and the War on Speech

Hate America Tactics

- V. I. Lenin: "We must be ready to employ trickery, deceit, law-breaking, withholding and concealing truth... We can and must write in a language which sows among the masses hate, revulsion, and scorn toward those who disagree with us."
- Soviet Union (1943): ...continually embarrass, discredit and degrade our critics... label them fascist or Nazi or anti-Semitic... constantly associate those who oppose us with those... that already have a bad smell. The association will, [eventually], become 'fact' in the public mind.

- Father of Sexual Revolution

- Created "PartisanTolerance" concept



Islamophobia and Christian Privilege: What Educators Must Know



Dr. Muhammad Khalifa

UNDERSTANDING AND CONFRONTING MUSLIM STUDENT MARGINALIZATION

- Recognize that Islamophobia is one of the most widespread, rapidly-growing, and tolerated types of oppression in school and society today.
- Craft anti-oppression policies that protect the rights of Muslim students.
- Identify discourses and practices of Christian privilege and White privilege.
 - Know that Christian Privilege is not only having major Christian holidays off, Sundays off, and Christian trappings in school;
 - Rather, Christian Privilege can encompass much more complex issues such as: community vs. individual epistemologies, approaches to learning, purpose of education, and even sources of and what counts as knowledge.
- Institutionalize practices in your school that constantly.
- Recognize that Islamophobia can be connected to Muslims (people) or Islam (beliefs):

- Recognize that Islamophobia can be connected to Muslims (people) or Islam (beliefs):
 - Muslims are seen as subhuman, irrational, violent, or backward;
 - Islamic beliefs are seen as antiquated (fossilized), illogical, incompatible with non-Muslim beliefs, or secular practices.
- Know that because of wide-spread anti-Muslim bigotry, Muslims students may mask or hide their Muslim identities.

EMPOWERING MUSLIM STUDENT IDENTITIES

- Institutionalize ways of gauging or measuring Muslim student belongingness and anti-Muslim bigotry in your school; Complete annual equity audits.
- Similar to race work that some schools do, Have Muslim student speak-outs, or other in-school spaces where they can express their identities, and speak about experiences of Muslim life.
- Recognize that Islam is not a religion in the sense that Western Europeans separated faith from other aspects of life; It is a way of life.
 - Accommodate aspect of Muslim life in school, including daily prayer spaces, prayer washing (ablution) spaces, and Friday prayer spaces, or fasting.
- Infuse curriculum and school activities with intellectual traditions that originate in the Muslim World;
 - Acknowledge the origin of knowledge that came from the Muslim World.



OIC Strategy to Counter "Islamophobia"

- 1990 Cairo Declaration rejected U.N. Universal Declaration on Human Rights. <u>Speech and other</u> rights must be Sharia compliant
- Goal: Islamic blasphemy speech codes in Western nations: CRIMINALIZE FREE SPEECH
- Media strategy: pay for articles, TV programs, speeches, etc. that attack any criticism of Islam
- U.N. Resolution 16/18 against "intolerance, negative stereotyping and stigmatization of... religion and belief." Obama supported
- Hillary Clinton urged adoption of 16/18 in 2011.

U.N. Migration Compact

European Parliament member Marcel de Graaff:

"Criticism of migration will become a criminal offense, and media outlets... that give room to criticism of migration can be shut down. The compact for migration is legalization of mass migration. It's declaring migration as a human right."

Efforts to Silence Us Since 2016 Election

- SPLC, ACLU, ADL, MMFA, CAIR defame speakers – quoted in media
- Threaten venues (ACT Mar-a-Lago)
- Threaten organizers (MI Conference)
- Threaten employers
- Disrupting events
- Photographing attendees and posting photos on social media
- Engaging in violence (Antifa)
- Lobbying for "hate" speech laws

Crisis Strategy

*By crisis, we mean a <u>publicly visible</u> disruption in some institutional sphere. Crisis can occur spontaneously (e.g., riots) or as the intended result of tactics of demonstration and protest which either generate institutional disruption or bring unrecognized disruption to public attention."

"Advocacy must be supplemented by organized demonstrations to create a climate of militancy that will overcome the invidious and immobilizing attitudes which many potential recipients hold toward being 'on welfare."

Crisis Strategy

- Organizes previously unorganized groups eligible for government benefits but not currently receiving all they can.
- Seeks to identify new beneficiaries and/or create new benefits.
- Goal: impose new stresses on target systems, with the ultimate goal of forcing their collapse.

Herbert Marcuse

"The tolerance which is the life element, the token of a free society.... [can] only be won in the sustained effort of radical minorities... minorities intolerant, militantly intolerant and disobedient to the rules of behavior which tolerate destruction and suppression."


